WHERE THE WORLD OPENS UP

The Accountability Pillar surveys are administered annually and throughout the province, during the months of January to March to:

- Students in Grades 4, 7 and 10;
- Students in Grades 4 through 9 (in small schools);
- Parents of students in Grades 4, 7 and 10; and
- Teachers.

Students and teachers complete the surveys online at school while parents receive a copy of the survey that can be completed online, or by mail. Parent surveys are returned directly to Alberta Education.

Responses are collected and tabulated into a summary chart released in May and are updated in October to supplement updated academic achievement results through the Provincial Achievement Tests (grade 6 and 9) and the Diploma Examination results (Divisional and First Nations, Métis and Inuit specific). These achievement reports are provided in a separate summary report on our school's website.

This Accountability Pillar Results Report includes our school's overall summary and new results for all survey measures.

## Approximate Survey Responses:

- 20 parents in our school responded to the survey. This is down from 28 last year. Unfortunately, low survey responses may not accurately represent our parent population.
- In Parkland School Division, approximately 459 parents responded to the survey. The five-year average for parent responses is approximately 406.
- In Parkland School Division: 2,560 Students (960 in grades 4-6, 700 in 7-9 and 900 in 10-12) responded; this included 78 students who responded from our school.
- In Parkland School Division, 457 teachers responded; this included 23 teachers from our school.

These are approximate numbers as not every respondent answers every question.

### **Highlights and Celebrations**

Millgrove School continues to celebrate the strong work of staff, students and our overall community. \* Millgrove School has maintained a high level of success in our Safe and Caring Schools category our current results in each of the sub categories are 90% and higher. We believe our results are due to our continued professional development in Literacy and Numeracy. The commitment of the staff to continue to research and grow in this area has lead to a great deal of success for our students. This combined with a School Council that has encouraged our teachers to continue to try new methods and to share those methods with our parents has made it an excellent partnership for our students continued success.

\* Millgrove School has also maintained its high level of achievement in the area of Parent Involvement due to its partnership with both its School Council and its School Foundation. In fact Millgrove School has scored in the overall area of Excellence in 6 of the 7 measured areas this past year.

Parkland School Division's Ultimate Goal is Student Success and Well-Being. To this end, the Board's current Education Plan targets nine assurance elements in student growth, teaching and leading and learning supports.

#### **Areas Requiring Strategic Planning**

We are very happy to note that in the 7 pillars that we are measured upon Millgrove school has an achievement of high (in one area) and very high and overall measure of Excellence in the other six areas. We had great concerns about our area of work preparation as it was in the high 60% range two years ago but with the aid of our School Council we targeted this area and last rose to just over 82%. When we look at our results in all areas we must continue to communicate with our parents, our students and our staff regarding the work we do as a school. In this way we know we will continue to maintain our high rates but we should also continue to rise in the area of work preparation so that area is also in the very high (excellence) range.
